

Introducing Pastor Sharon Kelly

Dear People of Galilee,

Allow me to share my story: I was born in Baltimore, Maryland to Betty Ruth Williams Kelly and John Anderson Kelly. I lived there, and took trips to rural South Carolina visiting my mother's extended family. Currently, my mother and her siblings, along with their spouses and children, all live in and around the city. We attended a Lutheran congregation across from our home (now consolidated with another Lutheran church).

I earned a bachelor's degree at the University of Baltimore, Maryland. I graduated from the oldest Lutheran seminary in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania (now called United Lutheran Seminary). I received settled congregational calls in Kansas City, Missouri and Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

My husband Thomas and I moved to Minnesota in 1999 because Luther Seminary extended a call to me to support students in congregational ministry. At Luther Seminary I started a doctoral degree at the University of MN in the educational philosophies of work, community, and family. While completing this degree, I received an invitation from the now retired Bishop Rogness to begin ministry as an interim pastor in Lauderdale, MN, where I now reside.

Having completed ten interim ministry calls primarily in Minnesota, (as well as Wisconsin, Maryland, and Pennsylvania) and a term as a chaplain in specialty care, these experiences affirm that God in Christ Jesus has the Spirit on the loose with calling and guiding congregations in transition. As an experienced interim pastor, the witness I have received is that the Christian church within society is
